




Quarterly Updates

Donor Engagement: Automated and Amplified







With Title III support, the Office of Institutional Advancement achieved a 28% increase in giving during the April–June quarter. Strategic enhancements to data integrity and ongoing staff training have enabled the team to utilize more features within the Raiser's Edge platform—automating key processes and strengthening donor engagement. These efforts contributed to a remarkable 32.4% rise in total donations from June to July, making April through June one of the most successful giving periods of the fiscal year.

ON SUNDAY, JUNE 17TH, RAM TRAINING CAMP STUDENTS HAD THE EXCITING OPPORTUNITY TO ATTEND THE DRUMLINE LIVE PERFORMANCE AT BASS CONCERT HALL, AN ELECTRIFYING SHOWCASE THAT CELEBRATED THE VIBRANT LEGACY AND CULTURAL IMPACT OF HBCU DRUMLINES. THE PERFORMANCE NOT ONLY BROUGHT THE ENERGY AND ARTISTRY OF HBCU MUSICAL TRADITIONS TO LIFE, BUT IT ALSO PROUDLY SPOTLIGHTED HUSTON-TILLOTSON UNIVERSITY.
