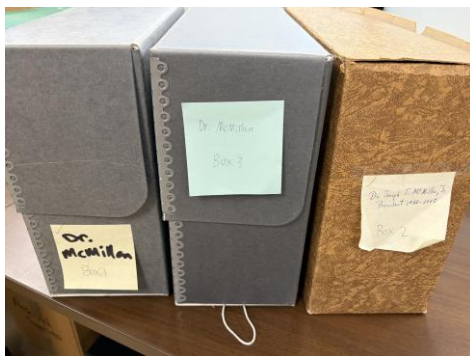

Biographical Notes:

Dr. Joseph T. McMillan, Jr. was the President at Huston-Tillotson College from 1988 to 2000. Dr. McMillan was born in Valdosta, Georgia, on July 19, 1944. He is the son of the Rev. J. T. McMillan, a retired minister in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, and Mrs. Olivia Cooper McMillan, a retired teacher. Dr. McMillan received his Bachelor of Science Degree from Howard University in 1965, with a major in Psychology. Later, he gained his Masters of Arts degree in Student Personnel Administration from Howard University in 1970, and the Doctor of Education degree in Higher Education Administration from Columbia University in 1986. He was also the recipient of two honorary degrees: the Doctor of Letters degree from Yankton College; and the Doctor of Laws degree from Huston-Tillotson College.

Before joining Huston-Tillotson College, Dr. McMillan served on the staff of the United Church Board for Homeland Ministries; served as secretary for Higher Education Relationships and Executive Secretary of the Council for Higher Education of the United Church of Christ, from 1970-1988. At Huston-Tillotson College, Dr. McMillan served as chief executive officer of the institution and a member of the Board of Trustees.

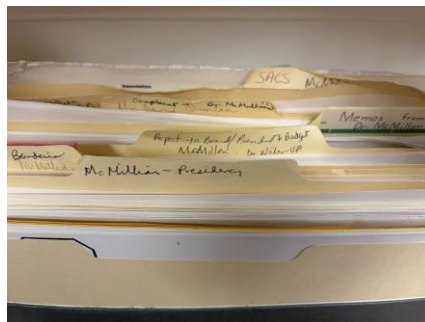
Scopes and Contents:
