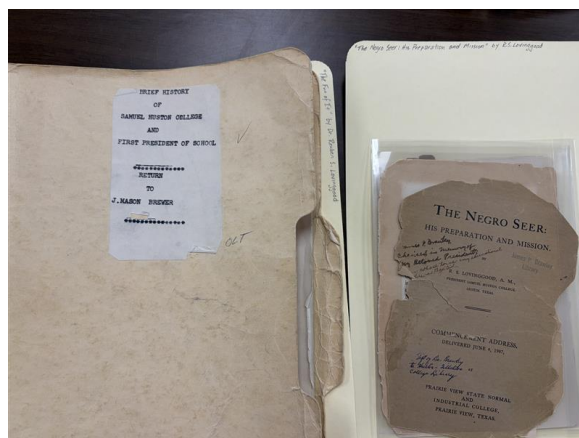

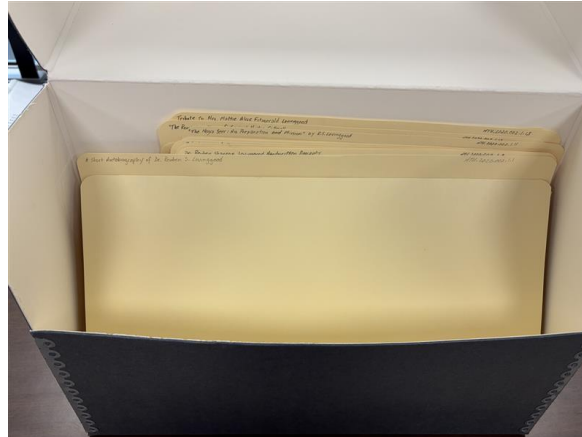

Biographical Notes:

Dr. Reuben Shannon Lovinggood was Samuel Huston College's first African American president. He was born in South Carolina in 1864. After he graduated in 1890 from the Classical Course of Study at Clark University in Atlanta, Georgia, he printed the Atlanta Times for two years. He then was principal of a local school in Birmingham, Alabama for three years, and chair of the Greek and Latin Language program at Wiley College for five years. He assumed the presidency of Samuel Huston College in 1900 until the time of his death in 1916.
