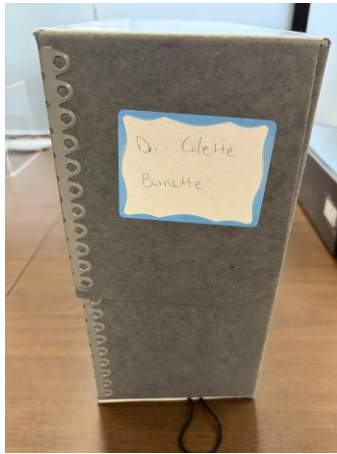

Biographical Notes:

Dr. Colette Pierce Burnette is the first female president of the merged Huston-Tillotson University, served from 2015-2022, and only the second female president in the institution's history. Dr. Burnette is a native of Cleveland, Ohio. She graduated from Georgia College and Ohio State University. Later, she earned an Ed.D. in higher education administration from the University of Pennsylvania. Dr. Burnette held numerous administrative posts in higher education, including serving as interim president at Pierce College in Puyallup, Washington, and vice president for administration and chief financial

officer at Central State University in Washington, Ohio. Dr. Burnette is an advocate for Civic engagement and serves on the board of directors of Girl Scouts of Central Texas, Leadership Austin, and the Greater Austin Area African American Chamber of Commerce.
